Ofsted are looking at how current research underpins a school's pedagogical approach. This course will offer an insight into the latest research and its findings. It draws on evidence from the Education Endowment Foundation as well as many academic thinkers.

This research can be integrated into all teaching and learning policies so there is a collective understanding on the school's pedagogical approach.

The course will also impact on teachers wellbeing as they will be working smarter whilst improving outcomes of the children.

Course content

Session 1: Focuses on assessment and feedback—looking at the effectiveness of marking and alternative models that are successful. We consider how marking can be meaningful, manageable and motivating.

Session 2: We look at the importance of planning and creating a learning journey to help children navigate their own learning. We consider how to make learning relevant to their own experiences. We look at the 5 minute plan and consider how we could use this in our practise.

Session 3: During the final session we focus on the delivery of quality first teaching for ALL children, based upon Barak Rosenshine's model of 'Revisit, scaffold, question, model, guide, assess, success, scaffold independent practise, review'. The layout of the classroom and how it relates to children's learning is also considered.
